

THE AGRARIAN HERITAGE AS **WORLD HERITAGE: SEEKING CONFLUENCES BETWEEN** THE PROTECTION MECHANISM OF **UNESCO AND FAO**

WORKSHOP SUBJECT

Agrarian Heritage is currently one of the most renowned types of cultural properties internationally as it brings together some of the social and economic aspirations most ICOMOS Spain. committed to the future of our planet and humanity: food as a fundamental right, the fight against climate change, sustainable development, etc.

There is social consensus on the relevance of agrarian heritage properties but disagreement on the procedures to be implemented for their recognition and conservation. That is especially due to the duality of approaches that are claimed to be the most appropriate: cultural or agricultural (the agrarian approach in short). These two approaches correspond, in a certain **Professor** of **Geography** at the way, to the two main existing international instruments for the protection of agrarian heritage: that of UNESCO, through the declarations of World Heritage and Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity; and that of FAO with its GIAHS Programmes (Globally Important Agricultural Heritage Systems). Although they are not actually very far from each other, it is necessary to seek confluences between both procedures (so far not achieved) to bring together international policies on agrarian heritage. This is the ambitious challenge of these International Workshops on Agrarian Heritage, the first meeting of this kind to be held at a global level. They will bring together in Baeza the greatest specialists and leaders in the field to develop a document based on a participatory and collaborative model, in order to define a joint action strategy between UNESCO and FAO for their action on Agrarian Heritage.
